ACSL CLUB

This club celebrates the art and fun of computer programming. Club activities include participating in a number of programming contests including the American Computer Science League. The club meets weekly to discuss and practice computer science topics such as binary number conversion, data structures, and digital circuit construction.

ACTIVIST ART COMMITTEE

The Activist Art Committee (AAC) is a student and faculty group who work together to sponsor exhibitions, guest artists and activities that focus on art that is linked to social change or social service efforts. Examples of events sponsored by AAC include display of the *Eating Disorders in a Disordered Culture* exhibit and forum with the artists and the viewing of the Academy Award winning film, *Born into Brothels* and the subsequent visit to HM by the filmmaker, Zana Briski. The photographs created by the students featured in the film were exhibited in the HM Gallery. The *Student's-in-Service Exhibit* which focused on HM student's community service efforts was also sponsored by the AAC.

ADOPT A CLASSROOM

The club members are involved in tutoring kids at PS 81, a local public school in Riverdale, during the week throughout the school year. We also raise money through bakesales for a classroom in Greenwich village.

ANIME CLUB

CITY OF HOPE

The City of Hope is a medical facility that treats and researches catastrophic diseases, such as cancer, AIDS, genetic disorders, and diabetes. Recently, the City of Hope has opened its own bio-medical laboratory in order to produce medicine for its patients. This club aims to raise money for this important organization.

MATH TEAM This most important club features organized competition in varied math leagues, and practice to insure excellence. Students develop a rich appreciation for the beauty of mathematics, and insight into abstract processes as they prepare for competitions.

MENTAL BOOM Off-beat Creative Writing Publication

MIDNIGHT RUN Midnight Run, a community outreach club associated with Manhattan's Central Synagogue, provides food and clothing to the homeless. Club members organize clothing drives, make and deliver food, and raise money for relief services.

MOCK INVESTMENT CLUB This novel club desires to improve student expertise in creating profitable investment portfolios through mock investments. The club will participate in a tournament run by CNBC, called the Student Stock Tournament. Many schools in New York City already participate in the contest, which requires each team to submit a community portfolio. All trades and research will be performed on the internet through CNBC's web site. At the end of the contest, the winning team will receive 200 shares of General Electric stock to benefit their school. In addition, weekly awards will be given to each member of the team with the highest percent increase in their portfolio. In the beginning months, club members will discuss basic investing strategies and methods. As well, there will be at least one meeting per week to review and manage the community portfolio. All interested HM students are welcome to join.

MOCK TRIAL Mock Court cases are practiced and presented by students acting as prosecution and defense attorneys in State and Regional competitions.

MODEL CONGRESS Open to all high school students, Model Congress is the newest of Horace Mann's eminent debate clubs. The Model Congress bills provide club members the unique opportunity to participate in simulated legislative sessions modeled after the United States Congress. At conferences sponsored by many of the country's top universities, students will be able to express their views on the issues currently facing our nation. As well, students will discuss foreign and domestic policy questions, and learn to draft mock legislation to address these topics.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

The Horace Mann Model United Nations team, the largest student organization at Horace Mann with over 100 student members each year, is a club designed to unify the world of international diplomacy and the everyday lives of Horace Mann students.

MUSIC APPRECIATION CLUB

The goal of this important club is to showcase musical talent at Horace Mann throughout the year. Students will audition for performances planned throughout the campus at various times of the year. Club members will run auditions and plan events. As well, the club will plan its grand presentation of HM talent, Music Week, during the Spring.

The purpose of the club is to allow members of the HM community to talk and discuss sports.

OVERHEARD VOICES

Overheard Voices features the work of HM playwrights, and includes a wide variety of one act plays.

Marathon Softball, another Pep Rally Club undertaking, provides a community service opportunity to HM students through its fundraising for such organizations as our Summer on the Hill program and the Achilles Track Club.

POLAR BEAR RESCUE TEAM

The club's goal is to raise money through bakesales and many different events. The club will donate all the money to the WWF foundation to save the polar bears which are now an endangered species.

PRIME

Prime is a magazine all about math! Members write, edit, discuss and publish articles for multiple issues every year.

PSYCHOLOGY CLUB The goal of this most interesting club is to explore issues in human behavior and psychological research of interest to H.M. students. Discussions will foster insight, and growth of participants.

RACE AND ITS PLACE The purpose of this club is to provide a forum for discussion of matters of race and its place in society.

Club members will accomplish their goal by first packaging unused food from the HM cafeteria, for later distribution. The club intends to coordinate workshops and assemblies with trained professionals, and later with students who have undergone training to address members of the HM community, as to how to set limits, create buddy systems, and to make safe decisions. The club also plans to establish a driving service present at parties, and run by students to prevent drunk driving incidents. Although the primary focus of the club is on alcohol abuse, the club intends to broaden its scope to include awareness of all drugs. Beyond Borders is an organization that supplies generous funding to all aspects of the Matenwa Learning Center, and the meal program is under their jurisdiction. WOMEN'S ISSUES

The Women's Issues Club meets approximately twice a month, once for a discussion of "women's issues" (media, current events, balancing work and personal lives, sexism, etc.) and once to hear a guest speaker. Past speakers include a photojournalist who covered Afghanistan, the doctor for the WNBA Liberty, a filmmaker, one of the first female rabbis, and a congresswoman.
